

Survey of pelvic floor complaints in women with Parkinson's Disease

Do you have Parkinson's disease?

Urinary dysfunction is a common manifestation of non-motor Parkinsonism and it can significantly impact quality of life. There have been no studies looking at the prevalence of pelvic floor disorders in Parkinson's disease patients.

Dr. Kathrin LaFaver and Dr. Ankita Gupta at the University of Louisville Physicians Movement Disorder Clinic are conducting a research study to evaluate the prevalence of pelvic floor disorders amongst women with idiopathic Parkinson's disease. If you are a **female between the ages of 40-85** and **have idiopathic Parkinson's disease**, you are invited to participate in this survey.

We are also looking for women in the same age range without Parkinson's disease to act as healthy volunteers. Participation is limited to a one-time survey which takes 20 minutes to complete. There is no compensation provided.
